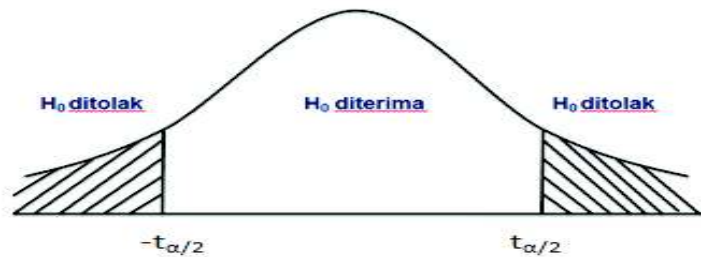


Figure 1 Two-ways t-test of Signification
